OPIOID USE DISORDER IS THE SINGLE MOST EXPENSIVE DIAGNOSIS CODE FOR MANY HEALTH SYSTEMS IN OREGON. The human costs are staggering – from infection to wound care, emergency room visits to hepatitis, the opioid crisis is wreaking havoc among Oregon families – as well as Oregon health care providers and health systems. And all the while, the very real pain that patients are suffering drives the search for a better way.

We've made important strides in meeting the crisis – we are improving pain management and opioid prescribing and re-imagining substance use disorder treatment to fit the illness as the chronic disease it is. Oregon no longer leads the nation in misuse of opioids. We are one of few states to have a decrease in opioid deaths last year over the year before. We are also improving access to non-opioid pain treatments.

Health systems, clinics, communities and practitioners across Oregon have been pioneering a full range of strategies to meet the opioid crisis. Some strategies have succeeded – others have not.

One thing is clear: Oregon needs a statewide event where those committed to defeating the opioid crisis and improving pain management can meet, share, learn, advocate and inspire change to improve the health of patients, families, and communities and support for health systems and providers.

NEW HORIZONS FOR SYSTEMS, PROVIDERS AND COMMUNITIES

The complexity of the opioid crisis begins with the diversity of stakeholders needed to meet the challenge and make change.

The Oregon Conference on Opioids, Pain and Addiction Treatment will serve as a must-attend forum for health systems, clinicians and providers, and community leaders committed to ending the opioid crisis. The conference will be tailored to the needs of system executives and policy makers, clinicians and community organization working to achieve change. Together, we will spark change for improved care and outcomes, provider relief, community building and cost reduction.

LEARNING THROUGH PROBLEM SOLVING

The Oregon Conference on Opioids, Pain and Addiction Treatment is built on the premise that we should all share in the successes – and learn from the mistakes – working to solve the opioid crisis across Oregon. The conference is organized around problem-solving sessions led by state and national experts using real-life clinical and policy initiatives.

- Sessions will help participants navigate common hurdles encountered when building effective pain management, safer prescribing and improved substance use disorder treatment. Sessions include transformation experiences that highlight the most promising opportunities for effective change.
- Participants will actively engage using app-driven polling for real-time feedback on learning objectives. This will allow conference faculty to adjust content to meet specific interest and needs of the participants.
- This approach will build on the success of the Oregon Pain Guidance conference held in Ashland over the past 6 years, and nationally-recognized for its problem-solving based approach to learning and change.

May 17 – 19, 2018, we will convene the Oregon Conference on Opioids, Pain and Addiction Treatment to bring together the essential ingredients of change to meet the opioid crisis: top national and state pioneers, system and policy leaders, clinicians and community advocates committed to championing innovative and effective approaches to end the opioid crisis.

The conference will begin with team-based care including clinical training across the spectrum. We will then explore innovation, problem-solving and transformation in three key chapters to meet the opioid crisis: the future of pain management, improving prescribing practices, and expanding access and quality of treatment for substance use disorder.

TRANSFORMATION NOW AND FOR THE FUTURE

Transformation and enduring change is the goal for the Oregon Conference on Opioids, Pain and Addiction Treatment. We will highlight the successes and challenges encountered when launching system, clinical and community-based initiatives.

STATEWIDE PARTICIPATION

Travel and registration scholarships will be available with support from Oregon Health Authority and health systems throughout Oregon to ensure diverse participation.

SPONSORSHIP

Private and public health systems are joining the Oregon Health Authority in sponsoring this important event which will be convened by Lines for Life and the Oregon Coalition for Responsible Use of Meds working in partnership with Oregon Pain Guidance.

Lines for Life is an Oregon non-profit dedicated to preventing substance abuse and suicide. Lines for Life launched the Oregon Coalition for Responsible Use of Meds (OrCRM) in 2013 at the behest of the Governor's Office to serve as Oregon's primary advocate for change to end the opioid crisis. OrCRM has worked with local partners to convene seven summits throughout Oregon to develop Regional Action Plans to address the opioid crisis.

Oregon Pain Guidance (OPG) is a diverse group of 70 health care professionals from Jackson and Josephine Counties, formed to respond to the growing number of prescription opioid overdose deaths in their community. OPG has hosted Pain Conferences for 6 years, achieving national recognition for their problem-solving based approach to learning and collaboration.
